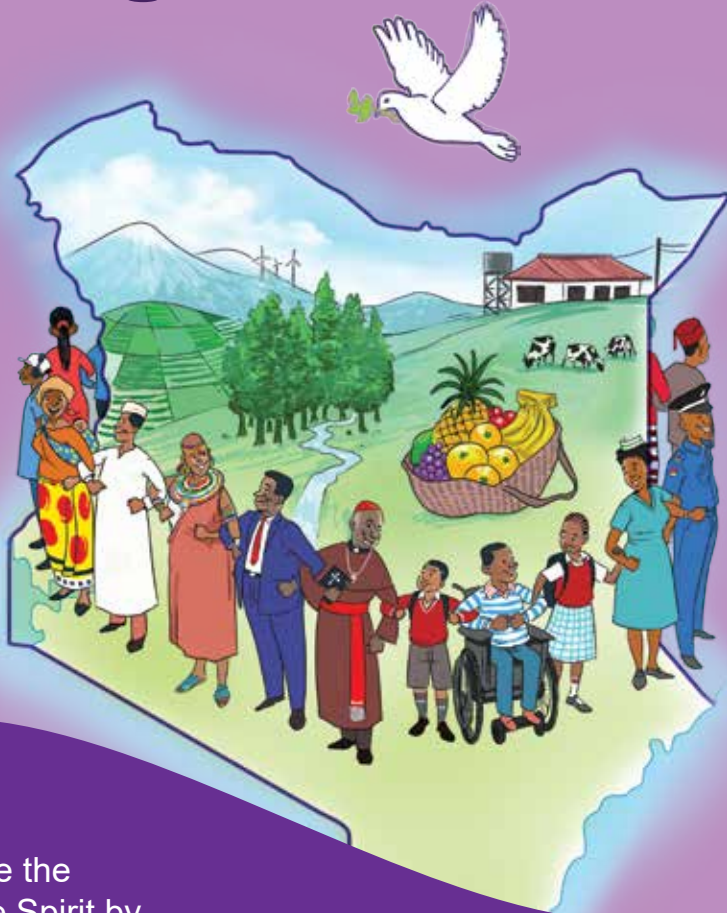

PREFACE

UNITY IN DIVERSITY: PROMOTING GOOD NEIGHBOURLINESS

People of God, we are now approaching our 2022 general elections. The tensions that build every time the polls beckon, if not managed, pose a risk to our national cohesion.

We must not forget where we have come from. We have in the past lost lives – including those of children, people have been displaced, others maimed and suffered mental illnesses, especially in 2007/8 following the bitterly contested presidential poll outcome. The subsequent general elections of 2013 and 2017 were not without their own challenges. It hurts us to remember such events and we must resolve to guard against any formation or person who will disturb our peace.

Elections come and go. Our past bears dark spots that we do not want to carry into the future. Our lives must not be disrupted by events, important as they may be. For this reason, we pay special attention to the way this year's general elections will be conducted. Together with our Bishops and their peace agenda, all of us should walk together in ensuring a peaceful election regardless of who wins a seat from member of County Assembly (MCA) to the presidency.

In Week One, we shall look at our **Civic Responsibility**, which entails actions and attitudes associated with democratic governance and social participation. It includes taking part in development activities of the government, the Church and community to improve the people's welfare.

We do this through a robust civic and peace education to our people who are eligible to vote and to the agents responsible for ensuring justice and peace during campaigns, the voting day and after the results are announced.

In Week Two, we shall look at **Respect for the Rule of Law by all**, which is the foundation to access public services, curb corruption

and promote equality and equity in the distribution of resources in our various regions/nations. It is one of the key determinants of the quality of a country and its governance.

Human trafficking is a barbaric behaviour at this time of history. Years back, slave trade was seen as an ethical commercial enterprise. Regrettably, this inhuman activity is rife in our own country. Young men and women are being trafficked across the seas to work as labourers but end up as slaves. It is within our powers as Christians to work with the Government and anti-human trafficking agencies to ensure that our youth do not fall prey to this black market business. **Human trafficking**, our topic of discussion in **Week Three**, applies to everyone, rich or poor.

In **Week Four** we highlight two other thematic areas that are of great importance to the Church. It is a shame that in the 21st century, millions of Kenyans still struggle to have a meal a day. **Food security** in this country is something that can be overcome. God has blessed us with fertile land, hardworking citizens and a favourable ecological system for production of enough food for everyone. Our challenge, unfortunately, is that we have depleted forests, carried out illegal logging, constructed on riparian land and intensified human activities on lands that should be left to provide us with fresh air, especially in urban areas. Pope Francis, in his encyclical *Laudato Si*, calls on us to remember that we have a duty to take care of our Mother Earth. **Climate change** is real. We have to work together to ensure we do not corrupt nature, which in turn will treat us harshly. It is possible to find ways of rebuilding our ecosystem for not only ourselves but also for future generations.

Our focus as a Church in **Week Five** is to ensure the youth are not victims of political propaganda as addressed in **Youth and Peaceful Elections**. We have seen in the past how political aspirants rally young people to do the dirty work of insulting opponents, attacking perceived enemies and harming innocent people.

Our youth should be a core component of our civic and peace

education programme. They have the energy to promote peace and love among political camps with different ideologies.

It is our responsibility as a Church to ensure our youth play a positive role as young citizens who hold their future in their hands.

We invite you to use this Lenten season to pray for peace and harmony in our country and engage in activities that will truly guarantee both national unity and promote good neighbourliness.

I wish you all, dear people of God, a grace-filled and fruitful season of Lent.

INTRODUCTION

LENT IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

In the Christian tradition, this is the period in the liturgical calendar from Ash Wednesday to Palm Sunday (Sundown). This annual commemoration prepares the faithful through prayer, repentance, giving alms and self-denial. The event is linked to the Passion of Christ and the celebration of his Resurrection. It is also in this liturgical period that catechumens are baptised on Easter.

Why 40 Days?

The number 40 is important in the life of Christians. Moses and the Israelites, for example, wandered in the desert for 40 years as they prepared to go to the Promised Land. Moses was on Mount Sinai for 40 days and 40 nights without eating or drinking water, where he had gone to receive the tablets of the Covenant God made with the Israelites. In the time of Noah, it rained for 40 days and 40 nights. Elijah spent 40 days and 40 nights on Mount Horeb without food. In the New Testament, Jesus was led to the wilderness where he fasted for 40 days and 40 nights.

Why the Kenya Lenten Campaign?

In the spiritual mood of Lent, the Catholic Church in Kenya felt the need to inform the public of the problems affecting society and advocate for change. Through the Lenten Campaign, the Kenya Conference of Catholic Bishops call for all Christians and people of goodwill to join them in addressing these problems and advocate for change. By joining the bishops in advocacy, individual efforts, our small voices become much louder and each individual's action is multiplied.

PREAMBLE

THE CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic Social Teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar and episcopal documents whose major themes are:

Life and dignity of the human person

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, human life is under direct attack from abortion and euthanasia. The value of human life is being threatened by cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching also calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding increasingly effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

Call to family, community, and participation

The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organise our society – in economics and politics, in law and policy – directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Marriage and the family are the central social institutions that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

Rights and responsibilities

The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights

are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities – to one another, to our families and to the larger society.

Option for the poor and vulnerable

A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between the rich and the poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Matthew 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

The dignity of work and the rights of workers

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God’s creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected – the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organisation and joining of unions, to private property and to economic initiative.

Solidarity

We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. We are our brothers and sisters keepers, wherever they may be. Loving our neighbour has global dimensions in a shrinking world. At the core of the virtue of solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace. Pope Paul VI taught that if you want peace, work for justice. The Gospel calls us to be peacemakers. Our love for our sisters and brothers demands that we promote peace in a world surrounded by violence and conflict.

Care for God’s Creation

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God’s creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

WEEK ONE

CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY

SEE: STORY

Mapato village residents elected leaders based on character, respect and one's values. They strived to uphold these qualities for self-respect and future leadership consideration. They occasionally gathered to discuss the community's affairs and had rules and regulations that guided them in decision-making. Children and youth carried these qualities wherever they went, including in their schools and daily life. The community lived in peace and harmony.

Mawimbi returned home from further studies in a foreign country. Although he nursed political ambitions, his long absence had made him to lose touch with the community values and was heavily influenced by foreign systems of leadership.

As elections in Mapato beckoned, community members started identifying a potential leader as was the norm. Although Mawimbi had declared his interest in the polls, he was not among the preferred candidates. On realising how low his influence was, he resorted to use money to buy support and was eventually elected, his unrealistic manifesto notwithstanding.

His tenure was characterised by mismanagement of resources. Community gatherings to discuss proposed projects and public affairs died. Residents realised that they had shunned their values and failed in their responsibility to choose right. In the next elections, Mawimbi's method of using money to buy support failed and he was not re-elected

JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

The preamble of the Constitution of Kenya recognises the aspirations of all Kenyans for a government based on the essential values of human rights, equality, freedom, democracy, social justice, the rule of law and in exercising their sovereign and inalienable right to determine the form of governance. Civic responsibility entails actions and attitudes of democratic governance and social participation. It includes taking part in the development activities of the Government, the Church and the community to improve the

people's welfare; getting involved in the democratic processes by electing leaders and/or being elected to ensure good governance, taking up community memberships of voluntary associations, playing a part in national debates, prevention and fighting corruption to promote proper use of resources.

Kenya has in the recent years been characterised by selfish political interests and profiling of people. There is rampant corruption in both state and non-state institutions, creating a feeling in voters that the political system does not work for them and any attempt to influence it will be a fruitless exercise. It may have also bred lethargy and apathy to participate in national duties. Lack of interest in participating in elections and other national duties as an individual or as groups of people results in the election of poor leaders.

To address this problem of voter apathy and civic responsibilities among citizens, there is need for all to comply with existing legislation. Article 10 (2) (a) of the Constitution provides for national values and principles of governance that include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people. Article 81 provides for general principles for the electoral system and Article 38, the freedom of citizens to exercise their political rights.

The Catholic Social Teaching also reminds us and emphasises on the need of taking our civic duty seriously for the promotion of the common good, the respect for the inviolable dignity of human life and for the preferential treatment of the poor.

This requires that as responsible citizens, we invest in analysing and choosing the right leaders who uphold the principles of servant-leadership for the service of humanity and for the stewardship of creation and environment.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Romans 10:8-13

Luke 4:1-13

In today's Gospel, Jesus clearly tells the devil not to challenge the Lord our God. St Paul, in writing to the Christian community in Rome, offers an exhortation to holy living. He writes: *"Do not*

conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect” (Romans 12:2).

Lent is a period of renewal of our minds to discern God’s will by keeping spiritual discipline to enable us not to be conformed to the standards of the world. In keeping with our dignity as individual citizens and groups, we exercise our natural rights to take an active part in public affairs, which may include being active in government, and making specific contributions to the common welfare. Our civic responsibility should be exercised freely in an informed, committed and constructive manner, with a focus on the common good.

Our interests have to be in harmony with the felt needs of the community. Conforming to God’s standards means being conscious of our specific and proper role in the political community. Christians should be a shining example by their sense of responsibility and their dedication to the common good.

Citizens should cultivate a generous and loyal spirit of patriotism, but without narrow-mindedness, so that they will always uphold the welfare of the entire human family, which is formed into one by various kinds of links between races, peoples and nations.

We need to create a culture where citizens desire and devise a common plan that transcends individual gain and personal ambitions. We need to elect political leaders capable of sincere and effective dialogue to address the deepest roots – and not simply the appearances – of the evils in our world! Our politicians should be genuinely disturbed by the state of society, the people and the lives of the poor!

People in every nation need to enhance the social dimension of their lives by acting as committed and responsible citizens, not as a mob swayed by various interested parties or groups. Responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. Local individuals and groups can make a real difference. They are able to instill a greater sense of responsibility, a strong sense of community, a readiness to protect others, a spirit of creativity and a deep love for the land. They are also concerned about the legacy they will eventually leave to their children and grandchildren. Society, through non-governmental organisations and intermediate groups, must pressure governments to develop more rigorous regulations, procedures and controls. Unless citizens

control political power – national, regional and county – it will not be possible to control damage even to the environment.

Not everyone is called to engage directly in political life. Society is also enriched by a countless array of organisations which work to promote the common good and to defend the environment, whether natural or populace. Around these community actions, relationships develop or are recovered and a new social fabric emerges.

Thus, a community can break out of the indifference induced by consumerism. These actions cultivate a shared identity, with a story which can be remembered and handed on. In this way, the world, and the quality of life of the poorest, are cared for, with a sense of solidarity which, is at the same time, aware that we live in a common home which God has entrusted to us.

PROPOSED ACTION

- » Seek civic education and empower others.
- » Participate in the electoral process as a civic responsibility; acquire a national identification card, register as a voter, vote and encourage others do the same.
- » Identify and reject corrupt leaders, and vote for leaders of integrity.
- » Sign the Catholic Church Anti-corruption Campaign commitment form.

WEEK TWO

RESPECT FOR THE RULE OF LAW BY ALL

SEE: STORY

Mistani was the head of the Mashaka State. One day while driving on the wrong side of the road, as was his habit, he knocked down Mpole, a cyclist. He fled the scene of the accident, leaving behind his car. Bystanders rescued Mpole but smashed the car's windows and fled as police arrived at the scene.

As the events were unfolding, one of the bystanders was covering the incident live on social media. Mpole was rushed to hospital by good Samaritans where his limbs were amputated to save his life. The recorded incident elicited anger and public unrest. Human rights organisations and lobby groups called out the behaviour of Mistani and condemned the mob's destructive behaviour. They demanded justice for Mpole. Police started investigations and invited witnesses to record statements. However, many onlookers feared to come forward because of previous experiences where witnesses in cases involving influential people disappeared mysteriously.

Mistani was arrested and arraigned. However, due to his political position and support from other leaders, his charges were dropped and he was released unconditionally. The media unrelentingly focussed on the plight of Mpole, who could neither cater for his medical expenses nor provide for his family due to the injuries sustained. This elicited peaceful demonstrations by the public demanding for justice and the rule of law to apply. Online petitions for the removal of Mistani from leadership were signed. Mistani was eventually relieved of his duties. Three months later, justice was served as Mpole was compensated and Mistani convicted.

JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

The rule of law is the foundation to access public services, curbing corruption and promoting equality and equity in the distribution of resources in all levels of government. It is one of the key dimensions that determine the quality and standard of governance of a country. The rule of law demands that people in positions of authority should exercise their power within a legal framework of well-established

public norms and not arbitrary or in a purely discretionary manner based on their own preferences or ideology.

The rule of law requires that the Government operates within the law in everything it does and be accountable when there is unauthorised action by those in power. It also demands that citizens must respect and comply with all legal norms even when they disagree with them.

The United Nations, of which Kenya is a member, emphasises that the rule of law must be effective and efficient in practice and application for the realisation of international peace, security and political stability. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights in its preamble affirms inherent dignity and the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family as the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world (UNDHR, 1948).

The *African Charter on Human and Peoples' Rights* (also known as the Banjul Charter) emphasises the importance of administering, promoting and protecting the rule of law in the continent (African Union, 1981). The African Union Agenda 2063 as well recognises that its implementation and realisation will, to a greater extent, be elevated by having governments and structures that holistically administer the rule of law according to international best practices.

The Constitution affirms that all sovereign power belongs to the people of Kenya and is to be exercised only in accordance with the Supreme Law. This is achieved through provisions aimed at:

- » Promoting and protecting nationhood premised on national unity and political integration while respecting diversity;
- » Democratisation and decentralisation of the Executive;
- » Devolution and separation of powers;
- » Entrenching values and ethics in the public service;
- » Establishing and strengthening constitutional and independent bodies to serve Kenyans and not enslave them; and
- » Prioritising integrity in public leadership for the common good of all.

The law should also be equally applied to everyone and protect all so that no one is above it. The law should be accessible, and legal institutions and their procedures be available to ordinary people to uphold their rights, settle their disputes, and protect them against abuses of public and private power.

Neglect or ignorance of the law results in its abuse. The Catholic Social Teaching affirms the need for laws in the society to protect citizens and facilitate orderly and peaceful co-existence. The common good requires that civil authorities maintain a careful balance between coordinating, protecting and promoting the rights of citizens. State activity should work to expand freedom as much as possible by the effective protection of the essential personal rights of all individuals (CST, 65).

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

Genesis 15:5-12.17-18

Philippians 3:17- 4:1 or 3:20- 4:1

Luke 9:28b-36

In the Gospel of today, we are invited to listen to Jesus telling us that the law is for the good of humans. It is meant to ensure that human rights and dignity are protected. We are called to respect the rule of law.

Law enforcers must firmly uphold the law while at the same time respecting human rights and dignity. Public officials are called to exercise professionalism and humanity, knowledge and prudence without discouragement or pessimism. These public servants should know many lives of men and women – with their problems and hopes – depend on their actions and decisions.

Duty bearers must adhere to a law by correctly applying the norms that guarantee – together with fidelity to the requirements of the law and other regulations in force – the scrupulous respect of fundamental rights of every human person. They must be guided by “the indispensable framework” of obedience to the law, attention to human needs and confidence in public institutions.

The growing culture of impunity is worrying. Some powerful individuals, mainly politicians, who feel they are above the law get away with illegal acts and utterances. The trend needs to be stopped if respect for the rule law is to be upheld.

However, today’s culture suffers from a “crisis of authority” – both in the public and private spheres – with enormous consequences, especially in education. The causes of the crisis include a declining willingness to obey authority, listen and be patient.

The true goal of exercising authority is to achieve “the common good,” and such authority is exemplified when power is understood as service, modeled after Jesus Christ who came to serve others and not to be served.

The more citizens perceive that established powers are generously aimed at trying to offer answers to their needs and safeguard their rights, the more they will be willing to embrace directives and possess a diligent and orderly spirit of collaboration and respect.

ACT: REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- » What is your understanding of rule of law?
- » How is the rule of law applied in our country?
- » What is our responsibility in maintaining and respecting the rule of law?
- » How do we observe the rules set out in our various groups (merry-go-round, small Christian communities, parish and diocese)?

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

- » Do I respect the rule of law?
- » Have I led anyone to disrespect the rule of law?
- » Have I been a champion of the rule of law?

PROPOSED ACTIONS

- » Speak out when leaders and citizens disrespect the rule of law.
- » Discuss how to respect and maintain the rule of law at the community level.
- » Hold multi-sectoral forums at the national, county and community levels to emphasise on the need to respect the rule of law.
- » Sign and commit to Catholic Church’s anti-corruption commitment.

WEEK THREE

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

SEE: STORY

Kwenu village was full of great men and women; culturally and traditionally oriented with values and practices. They practiced farming and small scale businesses, including barter trade. Theirs was a closely knit life of helping each other. They could easily pick a stranger in their midst. Their lifestyle attracted neighbouring communities who moved in, and with time, inter-married and became part of the community.

As the community grew, resources became scarce, leaving many struggling to provide for their basic needs. The need to look for alternative sources of livelihoods arose. Mpango, an immigrant, started a company offering jobs in his own home town. He established networks with various people who were in need of workers and willing to pay hefty fees. He would circulate notices within Kwenu of job opportunities for interested applicants. Demand for workers enticed Mpango to recruit even underage boys and girls without sufficient information on the clients he was connecting them to.

Mfansi, a trained hairdresser and beautician, was among those selected for a job abroad with promises of a good pay and better life. Excited about going abroad, she sold off her business. Upon arrival, her travel and identification documents and phone were confiscated by her employers. She was forced to do odd jobs for long hours without rest and pay. She was rarely allowed to access medical care regardless of how sick she was. She felt completely helpless and realised that she had lost both at home and abroad.

Upon receiving the sad story of Mfansi and others who had gone abroad, leaders decided to sensitise the Kwenu community on what was happening to some of their own in foreign lands.

JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

Human trafficking is modern slavery. Men and women are increasingly lured with false promises of better living while children mysteriously disappear in the hands of people who in some cases are not strangers to them. The *Kenya's Human Trafficking Routes of 2020*, confirms that human trafficking is prevalent in Kenya and

the unrelenting traffickers are casting their nets wider to identify new routes to prey on more victims. Human trafficking in Kenya continues to flourish due to increased poverty and joblessness and the increasing need for individuals to provide for their families. As a result, many are seeking jobs in the Gulf States, mainly Saudi Arabia. Others go to Italy, the United Kingdom, India, Malaysia and the USA often through legal or illegal employment agencies. There are also those who move within the country.

A 2020 report by the US Department of State lists Kenya as a source, a transit, and destination country for men, women, and children subjected to forced labour, domestic servitude and sexual exploitation. They are at times exploited in massage parlours and brothels or forced manual labour.

The impact of COVID-19 in Kenya is increasing the risks of trafficking in persons where poverty, unemployment and corruption by state and non-state officials are rife despite various interventions. Other reasons are ignorance, wanton greed for money, poor implementation of existing laws, porous border points and high demand for cheap labour in developed countries. Kenya passed the Counter-trafficking in Persons Act of 2010 which criminalises human trafficking and promotes local communities' engagement in the fight against the vice. The National Plan of Action 2013-2017 (NPA) articulates the 3P paradigms, namely: Prevention; Protection; and Prosecution. The approach continues to serve as the fundamental framework used by Governments to combat human trafficking.

While addressing survivors of human trafficking on the *7th International Day of Prayer and Reflection against Trafficking in Persons* in February 2021, Pope Francis emphasised that an economy without human trafficking is an economy with market rules that promote justice and not exclusive special interests.

"I address all of you who work against human trafficking and who are spiritually united today on this World Day of Prayer, which also has a specific intention: *An Economy without Human Trafficking*," said the Pope. Recalling that February 8 is the liturgical memorial of St Josephine Bakhita – a slave girl who became a saint and a universal symbol of the Church's commitment against slavery – Pope Francis also extended his message to "all people of goodwill who pray, engage, study and reflect on the fight against

human trafficking”, especially to those who, like St Bakhita, “have experienced the tragedy of trafficking in their own lives”.

Often the victims will return after experiencing tough life in a foreign land, untold torments and implausible agony. This trade is dehumanising and is against the Catholic Social Teaching . All of us need to work together to end this vice.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

Exodus 3:1-8a.13-15

1 Corinthians 10:1-6.10-12

Luke 13:1-9

In the first reading, God cannot let his people remain in slavery. He hears their cry and sends Moses to free them. Human trafficking is the slave trade of our days. As the world watches while human trafficking triumphs, the voice of Christ addresses those responsible for the marginalisation, rejection or damaging of people through this evil business. Christ addresses leaders in society, whether in the religious, economic or political spheres, using such strong terms as “white sepulchres, den of thieves, brood of vipers”, and other strong terms of disapproval to serve as reminders of the seriousness of abrogation of protection. With the voice of Christ addressing them, all those responsible for the severe discrepancies in life opportunities between countries of supply and demand need to listen with humility.

All those involved in the hugely profitable but illicit business of human and sex trafficking need to fall down on their faces and recognise the enormity of their crime.

All those who rape, misuse, and exploit women in the sex markets of the world need to ask for mercy.

Sex trafficking is primarily an offence against the image of God. Cultures which accept the inevitability of prostitution are deeply implicated in the crimes of trafficking particularly in the expansion of the markets into which traffickers can penetrate. It is time for the churches to turn their attention seriously to the many interventions which are required to turn the tide on trafficking, in countries of source, demand, transit and recovery, and to explore their own

practices for the dignity, equality and inviolability of each human being they welcome into their worlds, at organisational, pastoral and ecclesiological levels.

The conversation could lead to some dramatic changes in ecclesial practice and attitudes. Traffickers and those who buy women and children for sexual pleasure require words of judgment, and those sold need the words of liberation. The world needs a new culture of respect, mutuality and equality, of which the Church is called to be a harbinger. The time for tough conversations has started, while the urgency and levels of current abuse make delay inconceivable. We can create a day in our liturgical calendars to engage the issues of sexuality, power, abuse, violence against women in prostitution and trafficking.

By responding at all levels, theologically, politically, economically and socially, churches can make a powerful difference. The power for transformation is not lost in our time, it is merely resting.

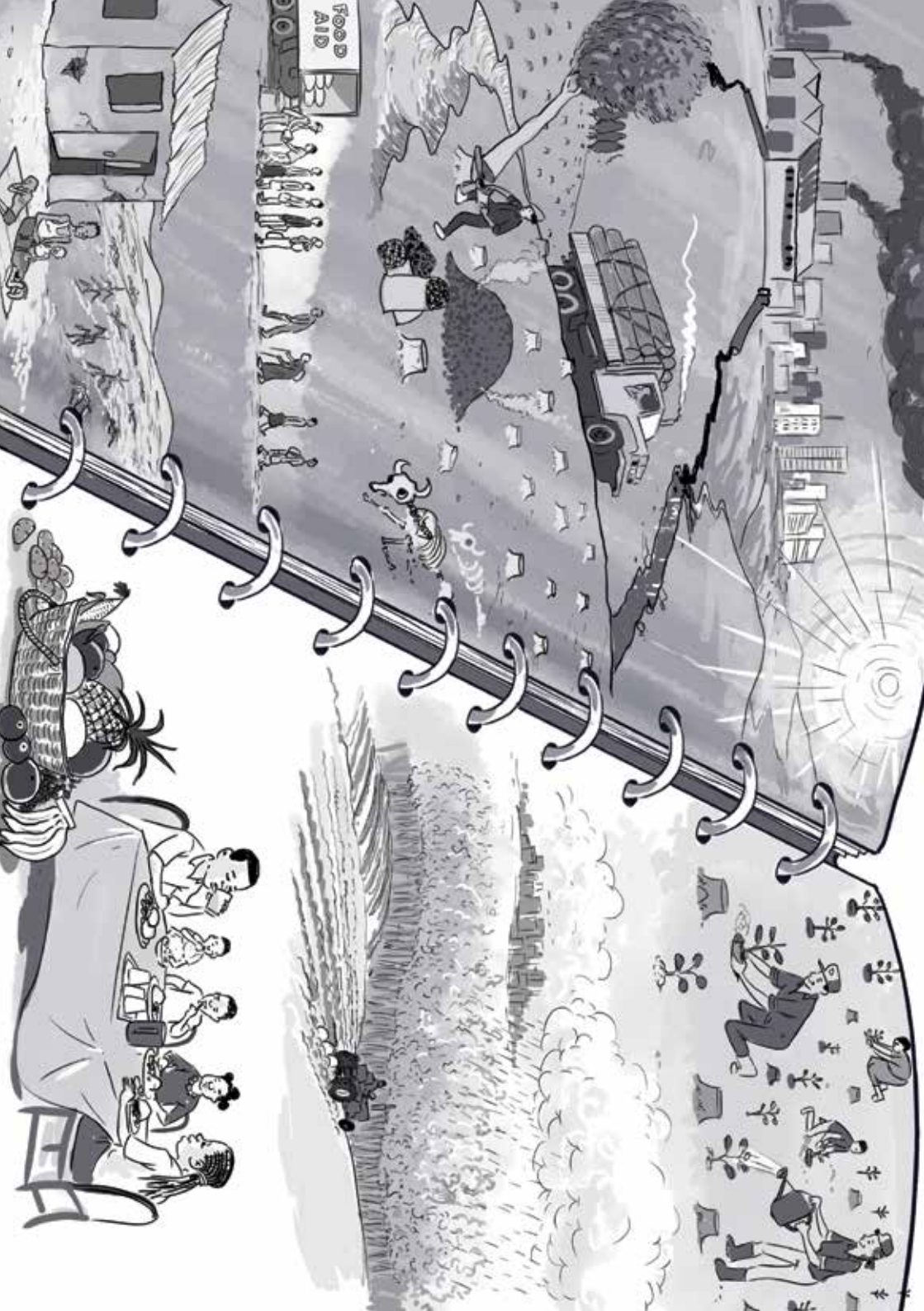

- » Initiate youth and children programmes in the Church on responsible use of social media and child protection.
- » Promote vocational skills, creativity and innovation to create employment and improve their living standards.



WEEK FOUR FOOD SECURITY

SEE: STORY

Baraka left Msitu village immediately after completing his high school studies to join Kilimo Bora University for agro-ecology studies. After graduation, he was employed by a leading construction company in Maghorofa City. It was a well-rewarding job with the rising demand for housing and real estate investments in the city where Baraka worked and settled with his family. He was proud of his contribution to its progress.

After some time, a health pandemic struck, disrupting economic activities, causing job losses and a rise in the cost of living. Many were unable to sustain their livelihoods. Baraka was not spared and he lost his job. Unable to sustain himself and his family in the city, he decided to return to the village. He was shocked by the deplorable and horrible state of the once flourishing rural area.

Smoky chimneys and rusty rooftops had replaced the previously visible forest cover. The air was hot, farmlands bare and dry and unaffordable farm produce was being imported. He wondered how long it had been since it last rained. He was informed that a few years back, lorries ferried charcoal and timber from the area in what seemed a financially rewarding venture to some individuals in the community. Parents subdivided their land into agriculturally uneconomical portions for distribution to their children. The forest was further cleared to pave way for a fruit processing plant.

He recalled how they planted coffee on terraces, pumpkins, sweet potatoes, arrow roots, cassava, sugar cane and other indigenous crops in the wetlands using traditional seeds and organic manure. The practice had many benefits, which included sufficient and safe food, fresh air and water, salt licks and other minerals and generally good health of the population. Drought and famine were rare occurrences. He appreciated the importance of integrated farming systems encompassing past and present best farming practices.

Baraka finally put to use what he had learnt in college, establishing youth and women's groups to engage in agro ecology and environmental conservation projects. The effort through the local Church and the community contributed to restoring the glory of the village.

JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

The Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) defines food security as a situation in which all people, at all times, have physical, social and economic access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food which meets their dietary needs and food preferences for an active and healthy life. FAO also envisions a situation in which all the members of the society, irrespective of their social status can access food. The Kenya Food and Nutrition Security Policy (FNSP) provides an overarching framework covering the multiple dimensions of food security and nutrition improvement in the context of basic human, child rights and women's rights, and the universal right to food.

Food security is threatened by non-implementation of the existing policies, natural disasters such as floods, drought, COVID-19, and corruption. This has left farmers staring at withering crops in their farms. In recognition of agriculture as a major contributor to food security, several African heads of state and government met in Maputo in 2003, and signed the *Maputo Declaration on Agriculture and Food Security in Africa*. The declaration required the members of the Africa Union to commit to allocate at least 10 per cent of their national budgetary resources to agriculture and rural development policy implementation within five years. Although Kenya is a signatory, it is yet to fully fulfill its commitment. Although agriculture is a devolved function, all counties are becoming more food insecure. None has managed to attain the least required budgetary allocation.

Individuals practicing small-scale farming, as well as multinational corporations are urged to consider sustainable farming methods which also serve to care for our common home. The pandemic has also proved to the whole world the interconnectedness between individuals, nations, people and things.

Pope Francis, in his encyclical *Laudato Si*, is calling us to awaken to the reality of climate change. He reminds us that climate is a common good, belonging to all and meant for all (no.23). As such, any change on it, positive or negative, affects all of us.

He notes that the poor are the most affected by climate change (no. 51). He relates the cry of the earth (no.2) to the cry of the poor. The earth and the poor have equally endured tears of lamentation. It is a cry which is not only an expression of pain but also an appeal to responsibility.

At the end of the celebration of the fifth year of *Laudato Si*, the Vatican developed the *Laudato Si* Action Platform which proposes a seven-year journey towards integral ecology involving Catholic institutions. The seven key goals of the plan are a response to the cry of the earth; response to the cry of the poor; ecological economics; adoption of simple lifestyles; ecological education; ecological spirituality; and community engagement and participatory action.

This is a journey “that will see our communities committed in different ways to becoming totally sustainable, in the spirit of integral ecology”. Everyone is called to start this seven-year journey keeping in mind that: “The Creator of all calls us to practice a new way of living, one that is good, true and beautiful” (*Laudato Si* no.205). We must commit to take action together because it is “urgent and necessary.” (*Laudato Si* no.57).

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

Joshua 5:9a.10-12

2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Luke 15:1-3.11-32

The readings of today give us the great message of reconciliation. The Gospel gives us the story of the prodigal son. He made a personal choice, thinking only of himself, demanding from his father the share of his inheritance which he did not work for. This choice brought disharmony into what was once a united family.

He had to go his way and even on his return, his brother was uncomfortable with his father’s gesture of mercy to his younger brother. Just like the prodigal son, our selfish individual choices have a general negative consequence to the larger environment. In *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis reminds us how in our choices we have offended the environment. Even the innocent suffer the result of our actions, which eventually disrupt the harmony that existed before.

Even though Africa has not contributed greatly to climate change, it has not escaped its impact. It is estimated that by the end of the 21st century, more than 180 million people will suffer the consequences of climate change in sub-Saharan Africa.

Deforestation and the negative impact of pollution cannot be ignored. Both international and internal factors as well as capitalism,

consumerism and liberalism have contributed to natural disasters in Africa, destroying the environment and natural habitats. One cannot ignore the effects of the global environmental crisis on human, animal and plant life in Africa. Water is essential to human and non-human lives. Poor water storage technology is one of the factors affecting the availability of potable water. As a people, we need to fight environmental destruction to protect and steward the environment as envisioned by God. We should constantly conscientise our people by pastoral exhortation to protect nature. We protect our environment because this is what God wishes and asks us to do.

As Africans, we need to apply ethical scientific knowledge for food production, to care for our environment by refusing to be polluting agents, living sustainably in accordance with God's will. We need to look after ourselves in harmony with our neighbours. Before the eyes of God, all creation is good. We should treat every part of creation as having its own intrinsic dignity. We still have time to choose clean and renewable energy sources. We are in danger from the food we eat, the air we breath, and the water we drink. Rational and honest planning of how to exploit natural resources is necessary. God wills that human beings relate to nature as intelligent, noble masters and guardians instead of being destructive exploiters.

Where there is pollution and damage of the natural world, there is no equitable and balanced stewardship of the environment according to God's will. Respecting His will requires appreciating ecological values such as environmental protection – the soil, forests, flora and fauna. Fighting pollution, deforestation and erosion are necessary for the protection of human life, for God wanted us to lead a healthy life in a healthy environment. Instead of fulfilling their role as collaborators of God in the work of creation, the rich choose to take the place of God, ending up provoking the revolt of nature that is more tyrannised than governed by them. Every Christian should set an example and lead their community in spearheading the integrity and protection of the environment.

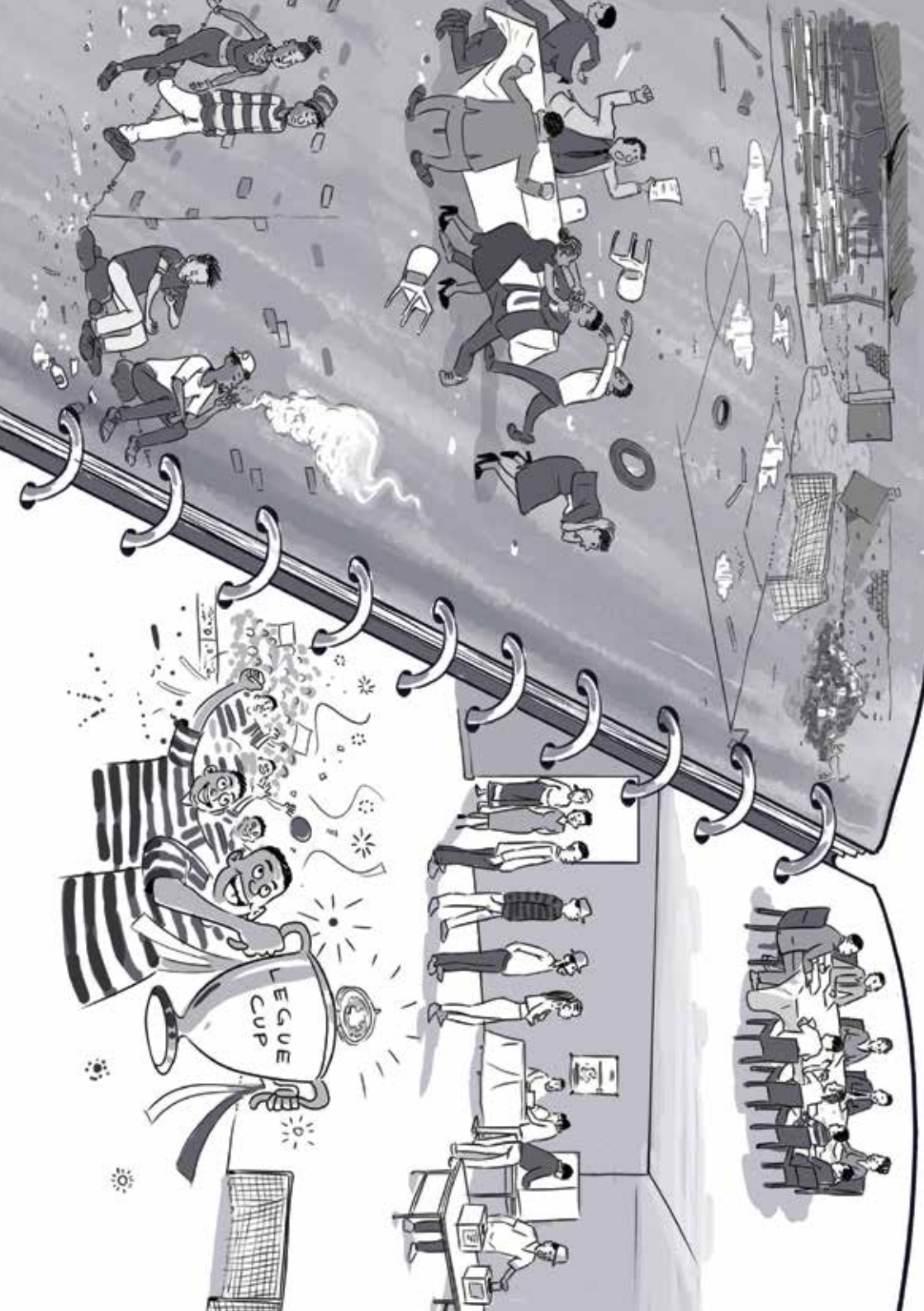

WEEK FIVE

YOUTH AND PEACEFUL ELECTIONS

SEE: STORY

In Kotoe town there were three football clubs which were mostly active during school holidays. The teams represented the three local clans and the operations of each were guided by different systems of leadership. With time, there were inter-club transfers due to internal wrangles among leaders who were mostly self-imposed, used money to get the positions or enjoyed the support of some influential political leaders. These actions caused mistrust, suspicion and eventually led to open conflicts.

Due to these disagreements, the gainful youth activities stopped, leaving the young players to cause disorder in Kotoe by now engaging in drug abuse, violence and robbery. Insecurity increased and unruly youths disrupted businesses. Unfortunately, some elders backing the drug cartel and promoters of disunity supported the disorder.

Concerned by the deteriorating situation, some rational elders representing different clans met to address the drug menace and other vices ruining their youth. They also came up with election rules for club officials and conflict resolution mechanisms to guide the management of clubs. The clubs were encouraged to meet regularly to discuss their affairs which would lead to prosperity of the groups and individual players. With time, most of the footballers joined national and international teams, which continuously encouraged more youths to join the local soccer teams. The economic and security situation of Kotoe improved as more funds were received from national and international football agencies to support local talent.

JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

It is essential that young people are positively engaged in political and other processes. Inclusive participation is not only a fundamental political and democratic right, but also crucial to building stable and peaceful societies. Article 100(c) of the Constitution encourages legislation to promote youth representation in Parliament. For young people to be adequately represented in political institutions, processes and decision-making – and in particular in elections – they must know their rights and get the necessary knowledge

and capacity to meaningfully participate at all levels. The youth and society at large are called upon to promote peace and cohesion in our community. The Church should build and invest in young people by inculcating in them values and morals for the common good. The Church's social doctrine states that "...those with political responsibilities must not forget or underestimate the moral dimension of political representation..." (Para, 410).

Political leaders should, therefore, desist from inciting youths to violence and instead formulate policies that empower and promote youth into leadership. The Church should foster Christian Love among the youth as divisions do not portray the image of God. Through his teaching, encouragement, optimism and trust, St Pope John Paul II constantly affirmed the role of the youth in the life of the Church as it is reflected in his exhortation at the end of the African synod: "Youth are the best evangelisers to their peers. No one can do it better than they ... Youth is an important period of physical, spiritual, mental and social growth. It is also the time when their values, life skills, commitments and morals are formed..."

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

Isaiah 4:16-21

Philippians 3:8-14

John 8:1-11

In today's Gospel, Jesus chose justice against a consensus that oppresses a member of the society. In electing, it's not just what the majority think but what is right and just. Catholic youth need to step up, lead and advocate for justice and truth in society. Young Catholics should consider getting involved in matters of society out of love for the neighbour to help create a society in which it is easier for people to come to know of God's love for them and in turn to love and serve Him. Their involvement in politics should be for the right reasons; "to create a society which supports the family and supports life to its fullest." In a society such as ours where the elderly dominate politics, young people need to take up the challenge by ensuring their influence is not just in numbers but also in the quality, keeping to a political engagement where they remain relevant and on the increase. Young people need to vote so as to protect and promote the common interests and vision on behalf of the society. The faithful youth are encouraged to be politicians,

thinkers and social activists who leave a good mark. God expects something from them. As Pope Francis advises: “It is very sad to pass through life without leaving a mark.” For sure this is not an easy road. God did not envisage a life of comfort for his flock. Following Jesus demands courage, a readiness to trade-in the sofa for a pair of walking shoes and to set out on new and uncharted paths. We are all asked to be instruments of the Church’s mission. Young people should never disregard politics and the more they take part in political changes – even becoming politicians – the more the Church can change lives. In this they spread the Gospel. It is very important that young people spread the Gospel. When young Catholics get together, fighting for a common cause, qualitative change is immediately felt in society.

- » Organise national and county youth conferences before the 2022 general elections.
- » Mobilise the youth to take part in peaceful poll campaigns through social media and road shows before the 2022 general elections.
- » Take part in the national tree planting day dubbed, *Trees for Peace, One Kenya one Nation*.

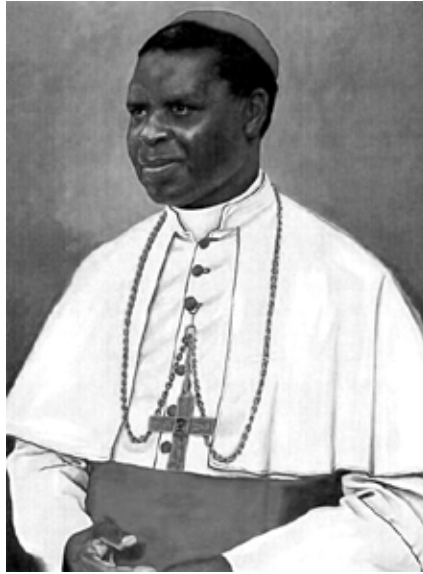
